Arthur Savage, the former's grandson and current president, explained in a following interview the complexities of the business, highlighting the importance of a ship agent to understand the many facets of the port, the cargo and the vessel.

A.R. Savage and Son works on all compliance and logistical arrangements to get a ship into port, discharged and/or loaded, documented, and out of port. This might include working with USCG, CBP,

and Port Authorities, taking care of the crew and required paper work— such as shipping manifest, stowage plan, bill of lading, and the like—and working with the captain to get his needs lined up.

The organization is very proud of its contributions to the Bay area, and looks forward to many more years of service.
